



EVALUATION SYSTEM

Foundational Stage

The assessment criteria in the Foundational Stage is Competency-based, promoting learning and development of the students and evaluating higher order skills, such as analysis, critical thinking and conceptual clarity. In addition to traditional focus on outcomes, assessment is to focus on learning process and experiences, analysing what the child has created as a part of their learning experience.

The Teachers' Observation, Parent's Feedback, Student's Self Assessment, and Peer Assessment all together will be considered for presenting each child's Portfolio.

Children will be observed in Competencies such as;

1. Physical Development
2. Socio- emotional and Ethical Development
3. Cognitive Development
4. Aesthetic and Cultural Development
5. Positive Learning Habits

Written Assessment in each term will be taken in the form of Worksheets.

The entire academic session is divided into four segments. There will be four evaluations in each subject as given below.

- Annual Exam / Preboard will be of 80 marks written and 20 marks Internal Assessment.
- For IX and X Std., breakup of internal Assessment (20 marks) in Scholastics is as follows.
- **Periodic Tests (05 marks) :**
- From the first three periodic tests, the average of the best two (reduced to 5 marks) will be taken for the final exam. The above 3 tests will have portion of syllabus cumulatively covered; gradually increasing the portion of content. The Annual Exam will cover 100 % syllabus.
- **Multiple Assessments (05 marks) :**
- These would make assessment more comprehensive, with multiple and diverse techniques to assess learners viz. observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, field-work, concept maps, graphic organizers, visual representation, quizzes, project-work, Self and peer assessment, collaborative projects, experiments, classroom demonstrations, etc.
- **Portfolio (05 marks) :**
- A portfolio is a collection of chosen work by a student representing a selection of performances that is collected over time and describes the learner's efforts, progress and achievement in key areas. This includes classwork, peer/self-assessment, reflections, narrations, journals etc.
- **Subject Enrichment (05 marks) :**
- Subject enrichment activities aligned with the secondary school curriculum aim at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These enrichment activities need to challenge students and permit them to apply knowledge to the next level.

Criteria For Promotion
